From Your Student Ministries Director's Desk

In the last week or so I've been able to meet with Young Life and FYSH students for some socially distanced fun. What a joy it has been to see students again! In compliance with governmental restrictions and orders we sanitized our hands, had our masks ready and were generally careful. I'd be lying to you if I said this didn't cause some grumbling and complaining from kids and leaders alike. It seems to me that the consensus is that many of us are struggling under the weight of this season of life. I'm sure if you don't feel it now, you've felt that weight before.

It feels like everyday there is something new. Do I wear a mask or skip it? Was that really what (insert politician here) said or is that a rumor made up on Facebook? Is this news real or fake? How do we discern the truth? I wish I had an easy answer that I could give you and you could then post to Instagram, but our world is just more complicated than that. So instead, as I say to my students, I encourage you to look for God in big and little, expect and unexpected ways this week. Maybe God is trying to teach you something through your fear, or a grumbling person, or your next decision. It is my hope that we see God at work in the world around us, and that we know him and make him known.

Sunday Worship, July 19.

This Sunday we will offer an outdoor worship service and we also plan to live-stream the service. The live streaming begins at 9:20 and the service itself will begin at 9:30. Bring a lawn chair or choose to remain in your car and listen on the radio. We will continue with the series of messages on the Lord's Prayer from Matthew 6:9-13, and from 1 Chronicles 29:10-13, with a message "The Disciples' Prayer: A Closing Hymn."

Student Ministries Update for Outdoor Worship on Sunday, July 19:

For the time being we continue to not have a nursery or Children's Worship class available but are excitedly planning for your student to join us in worship. Here are some of the ways we are doing that:

- Should you or your student be in need the front lobby doors, under the portico, will be unlocked so you can access the bathroom/changing station located just off the lobby. We ask that you wipe down the changing station with the provided Clorox wipes after use.
- We will have Children's Activity Bags, with coloring pages, worksheets available, and worship guides, available for students when you are greeted at the lower parking lot entrance. This will be yours to take home with you. We do ask that you provide crayons, pencils, markers, etc for use with these bags.
- During worship, we will offer a Children's Meditation. We ask that students remain with their families during this time.
- We recognize that while we are outside, we may experience children laugh, sing, shout or squeal with joy (or frustration) and we celebrate that they are joining us in worship today!
