This past Sunday morning, as we were preparing to hold our

first outdoor worship service our prayers for rain were being answered during our scheduled set-up time. Thankfully the rain swept through and ended in time for us to hold our worship service outdoors as planned. One count tallied 80-85 in attendance, and while a few remained in their vehicles, most sat outside in chairs brought from home. There was a good number of children present and even some of our members with immune system concerns were also comfortable enough to come to drive-in worship.

Let your Shepherding Elder know what your concerns and expectations are for the worship setting and for your attendance, as we want to worship, and we want to offer it as safely as we can.

From Your Student Ministries Director's Desk

The last week or so has felt heavier in a way that has been hard to explain. I think it's the weight of COVID-19 continuing longer than we anticipated. What started as a short school closure and shelter in place became a new socially distanced lifestyle. It wasn't what we had expected or been promised. I've started to notice that I am becoming comfortable with the new routine and this has made me sad in a way that's hard to put to words.

We are a people designed to be in relationship - it's the way we were created. God literally designed us for community. This weekend I spent time at a graveside funeral for a mentor and friend, as well as enjoying our first outdoor worship service and with some of my extended family. Each of these experiences are not the same as they would have been before the pandemic, but they reminded me of the simple truth that "we were made for this." We were made for relationships and community. It might not look the same to have church outside, or eat a meal with others, or to grieve 6 feet away from people, or hold a youth group meeting in the park, but we were together. We were able to be in community. This week I want to invite you to lean into that uncomfortable feeling of things not being the way that they were, and at the same time relishing in the new ways we get to build relationships and be a part of a community. The world might look different, but we were created for this and we have a God who walks alongside us in it.

This Sunday we will offer an outdoor worship service and we also plan to live-stream the service. The live streaming begins at 9:20 and the service itself will begin at 9:30. Bring a lawn chair or choose to remain in your car and listen on the radio on FM 99.5

This Sunday our worship time will include the commissioning of our new Elder and Deacons, and Pastor Doug will offer a few concluding thoughts on the gift of the Lord's Prayer, from Matthew 6:9-13, "The Disciples' Prayer: A Gift."

Student Ministries Update for Outdoor Worship on Sunday, July 26:

For the time being we continue to not have a nursery or Children's Worship class available but are excitedly planning for your student to join us in worship. Here are some of the ways we are doing that:

- Should you or your student be in need the front lobby doors, under the portico, will be unlocked so you can access the bathroom/changing station located just off the lobby. We ask that you wipe down the changing station with the provided Clorox wipes after use.
- We will have Children's Activity Bags, with coloring pages, worksheets, and worship guides available for • students when you are greeted by the lower parking lot. This will be yours to take home with you. We do ask that you provide crayons, pencils, markers, etc for use with these bags.
- During worship, we will offer a Children's Meditation. We ask that students remain with their families during this time.
- We recognize that while we are outside, we may experience children laugh, sing, shout or squeal with joy (or frustration) and we celebrate that they are joining us in worship today!
