In June, we begin planning the new FYSH schedule. In August, we put the final touches on the fall and decide what each bible study night will focus on. This fall, we are reading through and discussing the book of Jude. So last week, when Kyle and I opened to our passage for Sunday night, we hadn't really read through it for a couple of months. In it, Jude called out those who are building divides instead of building each other up in mercy. The scripture we accidentally designated for last week is about healing divisions. Won't God just show up when you need him!

I think it's safe to assume that we all understand the divides that our country and the world are facing right now. The high school students sure were aware of it. We spent a lot of time Sunday night talking about Jude's solution on how to heal divides and whether that really felt possible. Here is the truth, they don't know if the divides we are facing can really be healed. It feels too deep and wide to them. It was sad to hear that, but there was some hope. They felt that they could start in their circles.

Sunday night, we challenged our students to start by making a difference in their communities, friend groups, and schools. Today, I give us all the same challenge, because the truth is, the divides we face are too big for one person to fix alone. If we all follow Jude's advice and build each other up in mercy, I think we can see some of the divides get smaller. I believe when we find a way to heal rifts and build bridges, we bring the kingdom of God a little closer. Couldn't we all use a little more of that right about now?
