Between new MDHHS orders, the uncertainty around holiday gatherings, and the generally disgruntled nature of the season we find ourselves in, I think it is safe to say we all know what it means to be sad right now. For many of us, for one reason or another, sadness weighs heavy on our hearts.

The kid's movie *Inside Out* talks about the tension between sadness and joy. Towards the end of the movie, one of the characters says: "Without the hard times, how would we know when we are in the good times?" If you are like me, you might respond to that and wonder if it really has to be that way. Do we really have to be sad to understand joy? I don't know if there is a right answer, but I do know that right now, we are all holding sadness and joy at the same time. It is exhausting. Today I want to encourage you to remember that while some days are great and some are hard, we do not walk this journey alone. If you need a little extra joy, put up that Christmas tree early or turn on the lights, but don't forget that our hope and our futures rest in God's hands. And we know that he won't let us down. Today that is enough for me, and I pray it is for you too.
