Recently, I've been feeling that way a lot, and if you know me, then you know that I don't like feeling that way. I'll check every to-do list and think through every possibility trying to figure it out. I've been trying to figure out what I've been missing for a while now and haven't been able to put my finger on it. This was especially concerning as I headed off to Young Life summer camp on Thursday.

If you've never been to Timber Wolf Lake or any other Young Life Camp, you probably assume it is like other "church" camps. Young Life camps are unlike any other camp I've ever been to. They have been intentionally designed, restructured, prepped for kids to meet Jesus. Everything from how the creek flows perfectly through the camp to the way the dining hall is set up to the balls being pumped in the gym each morning has been rigorously planned.
