I love the story that Pastor Bruce shared with us on Sunday. I've always loved the idea that it took a lot of faith for Peter to get out of that boat. I've loved the idea that Jesus gave us our own chances to step out of the boat, to step out of our comfort zone, and to move in faith. This has been a Young Life club talk and a FYSH lesson, and I'm sure you've heard the sermon, maybe even a couple of times. It's a simple message from an inspiring passage. Bruce didn't preach that sermon.

The phrase, "Jesus knows, Jesus prays, Jesus cares, and then He shows up" keeps running through my head. "Where is Jesus?" "Why do bad things happen?" "Where do we go from here?" I often hear these questions from students, and truthfully, I find myself asking them almost every week. If we are honest with ourselves and with our hearts, we would realize that we all keep asking those same questions – no matter how often we get an answer. I pray that we get better at seeing Jesus. The truth is He's there, but if we think he doesn't know, or won't pray for us, or doesn't care, then why would we think he'd show up.

I'm an Enneagram 6, which means, without going into all kinds of detail on this personality typing system, that I struggle with overthinking and worrying if everything will be ok. This week as I was overwhelmed by everything going on in my life, I was brought back to a verse in 1 Peter that says, "Give all your worries and cares to God, for he cares about you." Friends, I'm not sure who needs the encouragement today to believe this, but the truth is: Jesus knows exactly what you are going through. Jesus is right now, literally right now, interceding on your behalf. Jesus cares so much about what's going on in your life. And Jesus is showing up for you. I promise, it might not be the way we expect, but He's there. We just have to open our eyes and see Him.
