Readers Note: In the Aug 4 edition of "Second's Matters," Zach invited us to be intentional about looking for Jesus in the world around us. For the next few weeks, he will tell you where he saw Jesus while on vacation.

Have any of you ever met a sheep in person? Growing up, my grandparents raised all kinds of animals on their farm. I don't know if we ever told anyone, but my cousins and I used to chase and scare the sheep so that they would poop. (sorry, grandma and grandpa!) What I always found fascinating, while the sheep were terrified of us kids, the moment my grandpa walked into their enclosure, they trusted him fully. He was their shepherd, and they knew him.

I wonder if you've ever felt like the Lord is trying to tell you something? I like to listen to podcasts as I drive, and I have some favorites; you've probably heard me mention them. (*cough* That Sound's Fun *cough* by Annie F. Downs *cough*) A few weeks ago, as I was driving to and from Iowa, I listened to a ton of podcasts. And as I listened, many of them mentioned, reflected on, or were overtly about the book of *Numbers* or *Psalm* 23. What is wild, just a few days before, I got a quarterly box of preview Bible studies at church, which included ones on Psalm 23 and Numbers. Since returning home, it feels like either *Psalm* 23 or *Numbers* are regularly showing up in my life.

As I've dived into these pieces of scripture, I've learned a few things, but I don't think I've learned everything that God has for me there yet. Did you know that in the original Hebrew *Numbers* is sometimes also called *In The Wilderness?* Numbers feels like a very skippable book in the "Read the Bible in a Year Plan" because it has so many names, but it tells the story of the Israelites as they wander through a wilderness. Doesn't that feel a little familiar – being a wilderness, where you aren't quite sure who to believe, which way is up, and when this all will end? Feels familiar to me. *Numbers*, I think, points us right to *Psalm* 23, where we have the answer. "*The Lord is my Shepherd, I have all that I need.*" This world is big and scary, a true wilderness, but just the sheep on my grandparents' farm knew their shepherd would protect them; *Psalm* 23 reminds us that the Great Shepherd will protect us, no matter what wilderness we find. I needed this reminder, and I bet some of you do too. Friends, keep looking. God is showing up for us.
