From Your Student Ministries Director's Desk

This fall, FYSH has been studying the book of Numbers as a way of learning about how God shows up in the midst of difficult times. As we were talking about the story of Korah's rebellion (Numbers 16), one student made a really interesting point. "It sounds like they are dealing with the same insecurities and struggles that we deal with today, just in a different culture and time." It was my hope, that as we read through this piece of scripture, we would learn that humans have continued to struggle with the same basic things for all of history. We want to know who we are, who we belong to, and what difference does it all make?¹

I see these questions asked all the time in my roles here at church and in the community. I talk with teens weekly who wonder how to describe or navigate their identity. I often chat with people in our church about what it means to belong to this body of believers. I share with leaders in my ministries and our church just how significant the difference is that they are making. Yet, that little voice in the back of our heads tells us we aren't good enough, we don't fit in, and the world would be better without us. That voice of fear can sometimes outweigh the truth we know about God, this world, and our place in it.

If I'm honest with you, I listen to that voice of fear a lot. I'm an Enneagram 6, which means fear is often in the driver's seat of my experiences. So here's my challenge for myself and for all of you. We are living in unprecedented times, but I don't mean because of COVID; we are living in unprecedented times because no one has ever lived today before. Think about that – no one has ever lived this day before. So if you're like me, there is fear that comes with the unknown of that. But let's hold that fear of change, of things being terrible, and of not knowing in one hand, and the truth of us being known, loved, and supported by the Lord in the other.

Things might change, situations might become different, the world might go through a pandemic, but the Lord remains the same. So let's not grumble like the Israelites did in the wilderness or start a rebellion like Korah, instead let's trust in the Lord and keep moving forward in faith. Will things get messed up or be disappointing from time to time? Yes, they will. But will the Lord let us fall flat on our faces if we are in lockstep with him? No, he won't allow it. Let's learn to trust more deeply in the Lord and his plans for us.
