When the farrier removed her shoes, they were showing many miles of wear as they were paper thin and broke in half when they were being removed.

Speaking of protective gear: Those horseshoes did much to protect her hooves as she needed those for firm traction, especially on slippery surfaces. If those were not on her feet and I had put that many miles on her, she would have been permanently lame and would not have any quality of life. It would have ruined her. Ephesians Chapter 6 talks about putting on the full armor of God to protect ourselves from spiritual ruin. Roman battle sandals usually had thick, spiked soles so that the soldier could anchor himself in the ground and remain steadfast. Regardless of how fiercely the enemy attacks us, we can remain firmly planted and anchored by knowledge of who we are in Christ.
