From Your Interim Pastor's Desk

Last week I read Zach's contribution to Second's Matters, and I thought it was spot on. I am in complete agreement with what he writes there about the songs in our worship services, and particularly as it applies to the sometimes problematic area of the songs we sing in worship services.

So that's how Zach and I see it. I know there are others who would basically agree with Zach and me. But what is the position of the elders of the church? That is an important question, especially given that the Church Order says that the worship services are to be "regulated" by the elders. There is strong Biblical support behind this Church Order provision in the Church Order.

To my knowledge, the elders have not adopted a position on the matters Zach addresses in last week's Second's matters. In my last meeting with the Admin team, and following that with the whole Council, I proposed working together over a period of months to develop a 300 word written statement that incorporates the input of as many of the congregation as possible, which will serve as our authoritative guide to dealing with many of the questions regarding our worship services that continually arise in any congregation. May God help us all to participate in this important congregational discussion.

I might be a Millenial, but the online world of social media is not my natural home. Truthfully, I despise Facebook, occasionally engage with Instagram and Twitter, and get sucked into Tik Tok. One of my favorite podcasters is active on social media, and she repeatedly talks about how Social Media can be terrible and a place where discipleship can take place. It is a sort of "Yes, and" mentality. As I was checking in on a few friends on Instagram the other day, I saw a repost of an image that I can't get out of my head. It shared dialogue between two imaginary people that said: "Aren't you terrified of what 2022 could be like? Everything is so messed up..." / "I think it will bring flowers." / "Why?" / "Because I'm planting flowers."

This weekend I started teaching through a series in FYSH I am calling "Scripture Revisited." We are engaging with passages that are favorites for things like graduation cards, Hobby Lobby signs, and for pulling out of context. Our goal is to better understand the verse in context and apply it to our lives more accurately. We started with Jeremiah 29:11. (Neither Dan nor I planned to teach on the same passage on the same day – isn't it beautiful when God shows up like that.) The thing we kept coming back to was that Jeremiah 29 was not as shallow and cutsie as graduation cards would lead us to believe. It really is God reminding us that he has it handled – the message puts it this way, "I know what I'm doing. I have it all planned out." So, yes, this passage gives us hope, not because it will all work out, but because God has worked it out. It's a subtle shift but a significant one. So as I think forward to this new year of life, ministry, and adventure, I know it won't be easy, but I also can expect flowers because I know God sees the bigger picture, and I have planted tulip bulbs.
