From Your Interim Pastor's Desk

It's been frustrating to have Covid disrupt my plans recently, and I could tell you all about that. But you no doubt have your own stories to tell along these lines, and we're all pretty tired of the whole business. So let me talk instead about some good things that are coming together, because God is with us and working out his good plans for us – plans to proper us and to give us hope.

Bette Wagenmaker and I have been praying, thinking, and talking together extensively in recent weeks about how we will go about starting and co-leading a new version of the Wednesday Bible study at Second CRC. Everything is somewhat experimental as we begin, but this is where and how we have decided to start.

We will meet every Wednesday at 2:30 pm in the old nursery room. At 2:00 pm coffee and cookies will be available in the old nursery for those who arrive early. We will end at 3:30 sharp so that those who need to go somewhere can do so. Of course, there may be others who choose to stay and visit together after the Bible study is done.

We plan to study I Timothy, starting with 1:1-18. We won't have a published study guide. No preparation is necessary, and it won't be a problem if you have to miss a session or two - just attend again when you have the next Wednesday afternoon free for it.

Bette and Vicki Gilliland have just finished going through I Timothy together without a study guide over the last few months, and they have found that the Holy Spirit sparks their discussion and leads it into often unexpected but always helpful areas of life. Bette and I are trusting and praying for that same kind of presence and guidance from the Holy Spirit in these sessions.

Bette and I know that such a format will likely lead us into areas where we may need to go back to our commentaries and do some research because we haven't learned everything yet. But that's all part of the adventure of allowing God to speak into our lives through his inspired Word. We will be eager to share what we learn with the rest of the group in the next week's session.

ALSO, this Sunday is the first Sunday when we will have an open discussion time in the old nursery room, 11:00 -11:30. I am looking forward to that. When I preach, I can see your faces, and sometimes your faces reveal that you are thinking hard about something. But I don't know what you're thinking. I am looking forward to finding out.

On this side of the garden, we know that our world will be full of trouble, disappointment, and hurt feelings - it is a given. So do we live lives depressed by that fact? Not at all! Instead, as Christians, we are called to speak love to hate, bring justice where there is injustice, and peace to conflict. In our little ways of doing that, we join God in his work of creating order from chaos. Where can you do that in your life? How can you join God in reconciling all things to him? How will you be different after this work?
