From Your Interim Pastor's Desk

In kind of ministry to which I am called at this point in my life, I come into situations in which there is some personal conflict in the Body of Christ. As a matter of fact, that's been the case in every congregation I've been a part of at any point in my life.

I find Philippians 4:2-9 to be very instructive and relevant in such circumstances.

When flawed human beings (That's all of us -- DUH!) interact closely with one another, inevitably some interpersonal conflict rears its ugly head. It can quickly become a life-diminishing drag, not only for the individuals directly involved, but for all the others in their community.

This was the background context of Philippians 4:2-9. This passage begins with Paul addressing a severe personal conflict that was currently disrupting the life and fellowship of the Philippian church.

² I plead with Euodia and I plead with Syntyche to agree with each other in the Lord. ³ Yes, and I ask you, loyal yokefellow, help these women who have contended at my side in the cause of the gospel, along with Clement and the rest of my fellow workers, whose names are in the book of life.

Notice that both of these women had a long history of fruitful ministry together, working for the cause of the Gospel on Paul's mission team. Both of these women were genuine followers of Christ who served their Master well. Both of their names were written in the book of life, and therefore they were destined to be in Heaven forever -- and together.

Nonetheless, in this life now they had somehow gotten seriously sideways with each other, and their interpersonal conflict threatened the peace and joy of the whole community. Paul is pleading with these two dear friends to reconcile their differences, and he is calling for all the members of his mission team to help them do so.

Interestingly, Paul himself experienced this same difficulty early in his own life, as he and Barnabas, his good friend and ministry partner, disagreed about something so strongly that they had to part ways for a while. We don't know the story of how they eventually worked things out between themselves, but it's obvious from certain scripture passages written years later that they did indeed work through their differences -- so that they could work together again as if their past split had never occurred.

I can't help but believe some of their fellow Christians helped Paul and Barnabas become reconciled, and I don't doubt that they were able to do this difficult work of peace-making by drawing on the power of prayer, finding joy and strength in the joy of the personal presence of the Lord, and by dwelling on all that was good and beautiful as they dealt with discouraging interpersonal difficulties in the Body.
