From Your Interim Pastor's Desk

What is our strategy for witnessing to our neighbors? How about "each one reach one"? That seems to make sense, since we all have any number of people in our lives who don't know Christ. Why don't each of us do what we can to develop a relationship with one of them, and then wait for God to open a door to share the gospel with them?

Could that really work? What if God made it work by providing an open door for us, and then giving us the right words to say at the right time. Perhaps all we need to do in taking up this call is to start by praying that God will open a door.

Paul writes these words from prison in Rome:

12 I want you to know, brothers, that what has happened to me has really served to advance the gospel, 13 so that it has become known throughout the whole imperial guard and to all the rest that my imprisonment is for Christ. 14 And most of the brothers, having become confident in the Lord by my imprisonment, are much more bold to speak the word without fear. (Philippians 1:12-14)

Paul shared the gospel with the total strangers who guarded him. Normally, these pagan Romans would have nothing to say to a Jewish prisoner, and little reason to listen to what Paul had to say. But it appears that in the long hours they were forced to spend with Paul, and in the absence of smart phones to occupy their time and attention, they began to converse with each other.

I'm sure Paul did his part to show interest in them, to listen to them, and generally be the kind of person they would start to like as they got to know him. In a very natural way, over time, as one thing led to another, Paul had opportunity to share the gospel with them.

And he did. No doubt many of them heard and believed. God's Word does not return empty. Other Christians heard about Paul doing this kind of witnessing, and began to believe they could do it too, with whoever God happened to stick them with.

And here we might have thought that when Paul was carted off to prison, his days of preaching to the Gentiles were done. Silly us.

Ask God to open a door for you to "reach one," and then be ready to follow his lead when he does. I just wonder how effective that might be over time.

From Your Student Ministries Director's Desk

I grew up the child of a hairstylist, and not just that, but a salon owner. That kind of childhood leaves a mark on you. We were never to put on a hat in a store because what if someone who tried before you had lice. Haircuts were a rhythm; if your hair started getting too long, you got forced into a chair for a cut. Professional products were the right solution, and you had to make sure your hair was set before a big event. Some of you may have noticed that my hair was getting too long – between scheduling conflicts and sickness, my hair cut had been delayed almost three weeks, well past the recommended 6-7. (Some of you may be reading this and wondering if I am ever going to get to a point – trust me, we are almost there.)

After my cut, my stylist shampooed my hair and had an interesting question for me. One of the times they were trying to reschedule my haircut was during a varsity home basketball game, and the salon owner said that wouldn't work for me. My stylist wanted to know why. The truth is she has been cutting my hair a little bit, and we've talked about my job occasionally, but I never went into it too deeply. I explained that as a Student Ministries and YL Leader, I often went to sporting events to support my students. I explained that the old youth ministry model had been replaced by a student ministry model that focuses on going to the students instead of hoping they come to us. By attending these games, I shared that students who I might not meet otherwise build a relationship with me and realize that I am a real person, not just one of those "Jesus people."

This new model, I shared, goes beyond just telling them about who Jesus is and hoping they change; it has you walk alongside them and show them who Jesus is. So, it is crucial to watch shows and movies that kids watch, listen to some of their music, and show up at their games and events. By telling them that they are important enough for me to know what is going on in their lives and change my schedule, I can build up a rapport with them. After a year or two or four, that rapport earns me the right to be heard by them as I explain who Jesus is. In the meantime, as they see me in the community and supporting them, they start to see who Jesus is by how I live my life. Are you disciplining someone or praying that they come to know Jesus? How are you meeting them where they are at? Are you engaging in their life and walking through it with them, or are you only speaking into it and hoping for change?
