From Your Interim Pastor's Desk

As I talk to more people about their hopes for the congregation going forward, I am getting the strong impression that the congregation as a whole is very eager to increase the sense of Christian community that we experience together from week to week. That encourages me, because I know how important that is in the Christian life and in the health of a congregation.

So how can we deepen our sense of community as a congregation? I'm thankful for the ongoing efforts of the Discipleship Team to get input from the congregation about their experiences of and desire for small groups. I encourage all of us to give them the input they seek from us.

I'm also planning to use our Adult Discussion Time this Sunday from 11:00 -11:30 to get your thoughts on the subject. I would also like to get your input on some of the things I am considering as ways in which I can help the congregation make progress in further developing this important component of our congregational life.

From Your Student Ministries Director's Desk

I have been walking around with a heavy heart for days now. When I first saw the news of how Russia was invading Ukraine, my heart sank. Since then, I have seen stories about babies being born in subways turned bomb shelters instead of hospitals. I've felt good about my wife going to school and not worrying if her students had their blood type sewn into their clothing if the unimaginable happened. I've seen reports from the 33 staff, 637 volunteer leaders, and 73 ministries based in Ukraine. I met with my YL students this Monday night, but they didn't. These real-world stories are so much more important to me than the gas price because each of these stories represents lives upended by this conflict.

It is inevitable that when some world crisis, like this, happens that tough conversations pop up in student ministry. Students might ask things like, "Why does God let bad things happen?" "Can Christians condone war?" "So what happens next?" Some students might not say anything, but at the same time, not be themselves. And some students won't know what's going on or pretend not to know. It's hard to navigate. So what can we do? We pray. We pray for calm minds and balm for souls. We pray for justice where there is injustice and love where there is hate. We pray for hope and moments of peace. We pray for those displaced by the posturing of people in power. And most importantly, we pray Maranatha, Come Lord Jesus!

Prayer for Ukraine

Heavenly Father, we come to you with heavy hearts as we see war in Ukraine. We pray that you would be merciful on the people of Ukraine and Russia and end this war. Grant wisdom to world leaders to effectively stop evil. Allow for the truth to be known, for lies to be shown for what they are, and for evildoers to be thwarted.

Lord, we pray for those who have lost loved ones, homes, and livelihoods. Comfort and provide for the needs of those who have been displaced and seek refuge. Lord, we ask for mercy and we seek justice. We pray that you would be at work in both.

We pray for the day when all wars will cease and when your peaceful reign will come fully. But in the meantime, we pray that you would use us to facilitate the coming of your kingdom here and now. Help us to take action to bring peace, to care for the victims of war, and to work for justice. Help us to live according to the principles of your Kingdom today, and to remain faithful until your Kingdom comes fully at your return.
