## From Your Student Ministries Director's desk

My favorite part of my role has always been spending time with students, and this last week was no different. Sunday morning, our high school Sunday School class spent time wrapping up our series on the person of Jesus. We looked in-depth at different parts of his life and learned from Angie Smith that "it's not that [we] know about Jesus, it is [important] that [we] know Jesus." Sunday, we finished by talking about three things: first, the story (from Luke 24) about the road to Emmaus; second, the story behind the song "Blessed Be Your Name"; finally, the question "who is Jesus to you?" At the end of our time together, since it was our last class, I invited each student to consider whether or not they were ready for profession of faith, and then I prayed for the class.

I am struck by how beautiful Sunday School has been this year. For so many students, the Sunday School hour is the most dreaded hour of the week, yet it has been completely the opposite this year. Students engaged with the content, good questions were asked, and I think we all learned something. At least I know I did. I learned that sometimes the most important thing to do is practice what we preach by learning with the students. I learned that sometimes I have just as many questions as they do, and it is ok that neither of us has all the answers. I learned what it looks like to hope deeply. I think that's the thing about Student Ministry that many people get wrong – we aren't supposed to be the sage on the stage; we are supposed to be a guide alongside. I think I've learned more this year about Jesus from these students than ever before; it is my hope they would say the same thing about me. What are you learning? Where is Jesus showing up for you? Because even when you think he isn't, he is.
