From the Interim Pastor's Desk

As I am sure you have noticed, sometimes I bring my "A game" to the pulpit, and sometimes I bring my "C game." A week and a half ago, on the 22nd, I brought my "C game." Every time that happens it weighs very heavily on me. I follow up by looking at what I need to do to avoid those disappointing events in the future.

On the morning of the 22nd I was in no condition to preach and lead the service. I've been living on the raggedy edge of exhaustion and burn out for the last 4 months – for various reasons, some of them avoidable and some of them not. Often when Sunday arrives after a particular draining week, I wonder how I will get through the service, but with prayer and adrenaline to bolster me up, I do get through it more or less well. But on the 22nd, the adrenaline didn't do the trick.

When I prayed about it, the Holy Spirit made it clear to me that I needed to make some changes.

Looking back, my mental, emotional, and spiritual "bandwidth" had been chronically overloaded, and my reserves were gone, as I increasingly was running on empty. I know that surveys of ministers consistently reveal that pastors typically spend 20 hours/week preparing for the Sunday morning service. I hadn't consistently been spending that much time on these preparations, especially during weeks when something big and difficult unexpectedly popped up – like a car accident.

So what do I need to do to correct that negative pattern? I've decided that I am going to reserve every Monday and Tuesday for studying, sermon preparation, and preparing to lead worship. I'll work from home on those days because there are less distractions there, and because I have an actual office there.

Wednesday mornings I will drive to Fremont, spend Wednesday night in the Harrington Inn, and drive back home Thursday evening. I will take my second night in the Harrington Inn on Saturday night and drive back home after the morning service on Sunday.

I also want to find better ways to connect with the people of the congregation in personal conversations. Wednesdays and Thursdays are good days to do this. I'd love to visit with you over coffee or whatever during the week.
