#### From Your Student Ministried Director's Desk

I love VBS - growing up, it was one of my favorite weeks of the summer. Each year of middle and high school, I would help in some capacity at Camp Iwilligoway at my home church. I loved the conversations with Ranger Dax, the crafts we made with Miss Sandy, and the time spent telling 5th graders how much they are loved. I will never forget how Jan Jungling, Cindy Van Weelden, and Laurie Nieboer would lead our teams to make an excellent VBS experience. Last week it was an honor to help out at Treasured VBS and see the work of people like Helen Bowyer, Carla Proctor, and Lizzie bring a VBS program to life. They reminded students of the truths that God hears, comforts, knows, forgives, and chooses us - we are treasured by God. That message is so important because I think it is one we often don't believe, don't remember, or aren't convinced is true.

Everywhere we look, we are confronted by ads, images, and influencers that tell us we are something less than ideal. We don't drink the right drinks, eat at the coolest restaurants, vacation in the right spots, or wear the right clothes. The truth is in some ways they are right. We read scripture and learn that we are not enough, but it is through the grace of God, despite the mistakes we make or the good we do, that God sees us as enough. I am the kind of person who is constantly asking the question, "How can we do that better?" or "What improvements can we make?" I find myself asking that a lot about the people around me too - I admit that I am not perfect at making space for people to be themselves, the way God created them. I don't think I am alone in that struggle, and I have to imagine at some time or another each of you have had similar thoughts.

I have been finding myself wondering how we make space for people to be exactly who God created them to be - flaws and all. How do we make space in our churches for people who don't think or live like us? How do we make space in our lives for people who don't believe exactly what we believe? How do we open our eyes to see people as God does, and not how they are different than us? The truth is, the kingdom is not monolithic, it is a complex and diverse tapestry woven together of people from tribe, tongue, and nation; every background, relationship status, and socio-economic level. That's what stood out to me last week at VBS - not once did we look at how we were different, instead we celebrated being treasured, as we are, by God. Scripture tells us that humans looks at the outward appearance, while God looks at our hearts. How can we be more like God, and pay attention to people's motives this week? How can we see others not for their differences, but for the ways that God has created them? How do we embrace those who are different as an act of living out our God given call to be people of love?

# The Prayer Corner

Last week I was reading an article in The Covenant Companion, the publication of the Evangelical Covenant Church of America. It was written by a female pastor in Anchorage, Alaska who wrote about how God called her away from all of her responsibilities as a staff member at ChangePoint, Alaska's largest church into a totally new ministry of transformation. She and others began to pray earnestly about how to make a difference in their city. As they prayed, God began to open incredible doors of opportunity. The ministry began to take a huge turn. Because a group of people humbled themselves, prayed and were willing to step out, God began to move. Transformation had begun in Anchorage!

But, here's the statement that caught my attention: "I knew that any transformation had to start with me," That's it! It has to begin with me! Did you catch it? It has to begin with me. Let's put that statement into the context of 2nd Church right now. We are on a journey, a difficult journey with bumps and turns along the way. But, the Lord is our guide.
