### From the Interim Pastor's Desk

Last week Wednesday I took a break in the afternoon and drove out to the Amish grocery store about 4 miles west of Wal-Mart. I was just past Comstock Avenue when the car in front of me pulled off on the shoulder. Sometimes people pull off on the shoulder for who knows what reason, and you just slow down a little and swing around them, not giving it a second thought.

As I was about to do just that, the driver of the car pulled back onto the road, and started to make a Uturn. I tried to go around her on the left shoulder, but she clipped me in the rear passenger door, and I heard the sickening sound of the collision. My car was not drivable.

She felt really bad, and apologetic, and I didn't want to make her feel worse than she already did. The nice lady sheriff and the nice tow truck driver both said kind words to her, and I did as well. People treating each other kindly when things go badly goes a long way to helping everybody feel better.

But I still felt bad. I started to think about all the consequences of this accident. One of them was I wouldn't get my "Second's Matter" article in on time, along with the other things I wanted to do to get ready for the congregational meeting. I wondered how I would get home, etc. etc.

The lady sheriff said "Well, if nobody's hurt, the rest of it is just stuff that can be fixed." The towing guy said the same thing. I appreciated their effort to be encouraging, and what they said was true. But I still felt bad, because even if it could have been worse, this was still bad.

I didn't start to feel better until I expressed my sorrow to other people (especially my family members) who listened and understood, and expressed how they felt bad for me.

One of my favorite scripture passages came to mind:

Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of compassion and the God of all comfort, 4 who comforts us in all our troubles, so that we can comfort those in any trouble with the comfort we ourselves have received from God. (2 Co 1:3–4)

And yes, it surely could have been a lot worse. God had protected me. He loved me. I started to feel God's comfort.

For we are connected as a People, and this hurt, this grief, touches us all. Be With all who move toward this need: The helpers, the counselors, the first responders, Those who offer aid and protection, the pastors And intercessors, those who meet immediate Practical needs, those who seek to heal physical Wounds, and those who come after to carry on The long, hard work of rebuilding families and Hearts and lives and community.

You alone have compassion enough to enter Our widespread grief, and turn it to hope. Be merciful, O Christ! Amen."

## **The Prayer Corner**

"Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding. In all your ways acknowledge Him and He shall direct your path." Proverbs 3:5-6

Recently while shopping with a friend I came across a small plaque with the words PRAY WAIT TRUST. The words literally jumped out at me and I knew the plaque was coming home with me. As I have thought about those words and how they were lined up I realized they were not in a random order, but instead a very intentional one. Before we can wait and trust, we have to pray. If we try to reverse the order we are doing things our way not God's way and we will run into trouble. It's that simple! Prayer is the foundation. It has to come first.

Pray, wait and trust are action words. They may sound passive, but they are anything but passive. They involve hard work on our part, perseverance, commitment and a relationship with our heavenly Father. Remember how in Matthew 26:40 in the Garden of Gethsemane Jesus asked His disciples "Could you men not keep watch with me for one hour?" He asked Peter "Watch and pray so that you will not fall into temptation. The spirit is willing, but the body is weak." If we don't stay connected to Him through prayer we will fall into temptation. Prayer requires a submissive spirit to yield to His timing and direction. When we pray we should adore Him, praise His name, and confess our sins before bringing our requests. When we come with our requests first, we have things backwards.

We all experience times of waiting whether in the grocery line, at a stop light, for medical test results, a job interview, direction in our lives or for God to answer the deepest cry of our hearts. To the Christian, waiting involves dependence on the Lord and trust that He knows the future. Think about the account of Mary and Martha and the death of their brother Lazarus in

John 11:1-37. In their minds, Jesus had waited too long. He could have saved their brother's life if only He had come sooner and they didn't hold back from telling Him so. Jesus had an additional purpose in bringing Lazarus back to life. He was teaching Mary and Martha to trust His timing and not to complain. While we are in "God's waiting room" however long or short it may be, we too have to listen to His voice while we continue to love and serve Him and without complaining.

Pray, wait and trust together form a cord that cannot easily be broken. There's strength, resilience and hope as we pray, wait and trust in the Lord. Are you learning to do so?

Lord, you know how prone we are to do things our way. Forgive us and teach us to pray first and then wait and trust you for the answers.
