## From Your Student Ministries Director's desk

I've thought a lot about what to put in my last Second's Matters article. Truthfully the story I will share, I hesitated to because of a level of fear of judgment. As I've thought more, I feel strongly that this is the story the Lord wants me to share.

Last week I was at Timber Wolf Lake for Young Life camp. It was a... different experience than I expected. Due to a series of events, I ended up only having one boy on the trip with me, and because of some medical needs, he had to go home early. Here I was, night two, and at camp as a leader without a student (we did have a couple of girls with their leader). I considered going home but decided to stay and offer to wash dishes in the kitchen. Instead, they asked me to help by sharing a part of my story with the camp on their Real Life team – both of the guys who had done it the last few weeks couldn't stay for this final week of camp. Reluctantly I agreed.

After that first Real Life session on the morning of Day 3, they asked me to help with something else. I became a Head Leader for the rest of the week since they were down two -Head Leaders help the camp run smoothly, deal with issues as they come up, and are a resource for leaders. Apparently, someone on the Assigned Team had a dream that I should do it. As the week went on, despite wanting to go home, it was clear that the Lord had orchestrated this moment so I could step into situations and give rest to the team that had been serving at the camp for weeks. God showed up - in big and little ways.

I think more often than not, we think like me. We don't want to - even when it is really clear where God is pointing us. I know that most of us at Second Church have been struggling with this. Do we stay, or do we go? Do we go all in, or do we limp along? Do we try to find a solution, or do we give up? I've never pretended to have all the answers – truthfully, if I've learned anything in these last six years, finding the answer isn't the goal. I think our real goal is being faithful in the journey. The Lord fills in the cracks where we fall short; we know he will do that without failing. So as faithfully as possible, it is our duty to follow Jesus' command to love him with our whole selves and to love our neighbors as ourselves. So I have one last question for you, Second Church: Are you faithful in the journey; do your actions align with what you say and what the Lord has pointed you to?
