Ukraine Update

On February sixth, the form I-134A was sent and received by the USCIS. We were informed that in about two weeks they would start to process the application and if any additional information was required, we would be contacted. so far no new news on that.

Ever since we offered sponsorship to the Platzer family I have been communicating with them daily, they are a wonderful family, very inquisitive and want to know about us as a church and about us as individuals. They along with their extended family have led a very interesting life, and are willing to share it with us. I have asked Maryna if I could share both their e-mail address and phone number to message them, she said she would look forward to hearing from our congregation. Last week she commented to me that "Our church and team have helped us a lot, it's incredible the help you continue to give us. You have filled us with information on USCIS, it is already a lot. You provide us with moral and informational support. It's just priceless! We thank you for this and will be in debt to you for the rest of our lives".

I would like to encourage us as a congregation to reach out to them and make them feel as comfortable as possible as they leave their families and country behind. They are currently living in a small two room apartment with electricity and internet that goes out for six hours a day. Prayer Corner

For the concluding session of our Ezekiel Bible study we looked the work of the Holy Spirit before Jesus's birth, at the time of His birth and at the time of His consecration at the temple. Godly and elderly Simeon, waiting to see the promised Messiah before he died, knew at once that baby Jesus was the One who had been promised by God. The prophetess Anna could hardly contain her excitement when she saw baby Jesus in the temple. She too knew that He was the promised Messiah for whom she had been waiting for so long.

The first steps toward the unexplainable revival that Jesus was bringing were beginning to be seen. The Holy Spirit was present at the time of His baptism by John the Baptist and it was clear that His public ministry would be characterized by the power of the Holy Spirit. In teaching His disciples how to pray, Jesus was teaching them about the power of the Holy Spirit in their lives. The intimacy with which Jesus prayed to His Father comes from the Holy Spirit and was available to the disciples and to each of us too.

"The Holy Spirit's purpose, according to Jesus, serves to strengthen and embolden the disciples for the work of evangelism and to develop greater intimacy with God. The Holy Spirit is meant to authentic Christ, not authorize a temporary spiritual high. If we want revival, we need to be asking the Holy Spirit to perform the work in us that Jesus taught us to ask Him to do."

Are you willing to ask the Lord to revive you and do the work in and through you that only He can do?
