# Living in Christ

"So then, just as you received Christ Jesus as Lord, continue to live your lives in him" Colossians 2:6.

What does it mean to live your life in Him? It means living a life of abiding trust and submission to the Lord. We are to live worthy of our calling in Him and this can be done only as we allow the Holy Spirit to lead us each day. It is only as we receive from Him can we can walk in Him. This connectedness to Christ in the non-Christian, secular society of today is mis-understood, often opposed and ridiculed. While people might not understand, we can trust that they will see Christ in our actions, words and our facial expressions.

As we spend time in The Word and prayer our lives become rooted in Him. Just as a tree's root system gains its stability in the dirt, our rootedness in Christ gives us strength and endurance to walk where He leads us. Sometimes He'll lead our steps through painful situations, sometimes through routine days and often into pleasant, blessed places. As we live for Him we can look back on our lives and remember how He has led us through what appeared at the time to be some impossible situations. Only God...

Living in Christ also involves putting action to our commitment. With Christ as our model we will see people differently. We will see them as Christ sees them and will interact with them in loving ways, as He did. Think about Jesus' public ministry and the people He touched with His love and compassion. He went to where the needs were. As we walk in Christ we are to do the same. But remember, He will never send you into something alone. Our walk with Him might take us to familiar places, but also to new places....perhaps to a homeless shelter; on a short-term mission assignment; to work on a food truck; to your next door neighbor's home; or into the adoption of a child. Wherever He calls you to go or whatever assignment to take on, He will give you the strength to complete it. Keep on walking!
