Luke 2: 15-18

"When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let us go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has told us about. So they hurried off and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby, who was lying in the manger. When they had seen him, they spread the word concerning what had been told them about this child, and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds said to them."

Luke 5: 1-4, 9, 10

"One day as Jesus was standing by the Lake of Gennesaret with the people crowding around Him and listening to the Word of God, he saw at the water's edge two boats left there by the fishermen, who were washing their nets. He got into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon and asked him to put out a little from shore. There he sat down and taught the people from the boat. When he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Put out into deep water, and let down the nets for a catch." ...For he and all his companions were astonished at the catch of fish they had taken, and so were James, and John the sons of Zebedee, Simon's partners.
