# **Notes from the Music Director's desk**

I have the privilege of being a guest contributor to the Second's Matters this week! First of all, thank you for such a warm welcome into your fellowship! I was totally enjoying retirement, but felt God was nudging me, saying He had something more for me yet. I wasn't sure I was ready to step back into a leadership role. It was a pleasure to go to church and just worship—not sweating all the details. But God kept putting people in my path and I felt Him calling me to say yes. So, after a bit of a crazy start (working a few weeks, leaving for a month, and now jumping back in), Dan and I look forward to growing in Christ with you! I want to give a huge thank you to Mary Folkema for helping me transition into my new role. She was, and still is, such a blessing to me! And then there's the rest of the staff...wow! The staff here provides such a great Christ-centered atmosphere in which to work and fellowship together! Add to that a great team of volunteers every Sunday morning, and I am feeling so grateful and blessed!

As I get more involved in my role, I want to share a bit of my thought process and vision. I think the biggest challenge I face is to find a balance between the familiar and the new. The church has committed to a vision of blended music. I love hymns—both old and new—but I also love learning the new contemporary Christian music. So, what will this look like for Second Church? For me, it starts with praying over every service plan. Then I need to actually choose music. My first step is to look closely at lyrics to see if they are biblically correct, doctrinally sound and God-focused. If a song meets that criteria, then I look at how singable it is for a congregation. This doesn't mean it will be easy the first time, but can a song be learned? One of my goals is to have music notes on the screen for as many songs as possible to help you learn them. Next, I look for songs that I hope have depth and longevity—not just be a fleeting popular hit. And when it's right, all of the pieces of a worship service will fit together to draw us closer to God! This is not an easy task, but God is faithful and I continue to look to Him to guide the choices we make. I covet your prayers and support. (How cool is it to read the prayer guide and know you were specifically asked to pray for me today?!?! THANK YOU!!)

As we heard last Sunday, all of life is worship! It is our posture—how we carry ourselves in every part of every day. When we see music as a part of this life of worship, hopefully we are reminded that the number one purpose of our music is to glorify God. Ask yourself: even if a song may not be my preferred style, can I—as a part of the family of God—worship God through it? I hope and pray that the music we choose allows you to answer that with a hearty **YES!** And on that note, I am always open to suggestions. Please feel free to connect with me during the week through emails, phone calls, or visits. I have an office in the corner by the elevator (with a candy dish!!) and would love to chat with you. I would also love to get more of you involved on the Praise Team, including some of our upper elementary/middle/high school age young people! I'm praying for hearts and minds to be open to this!!

Finally, we have a special week ahead of us, beginning on Palm Sunday, traveling down the *Via Dolorosa*—the way of suffering, to the cross, to the grave...and ultimately, to a Resurrection Sunday celebration! Invite your family, friends and neighbors to come, remember, and celebrate with us. Palm Sunday and Resurrection Sunday—9:30am and Good Friday Communion Service—7pm.
