"Hey Church Family,

It has been a challenging few weeks for me as your pastor. I'd be lying if I said that I was fine and things are business as usual. But it is also true that God promises to be with us in the valley, and friends, He has shown up in such beautiful ways. We have seen as a church just in these last few weeks the spiritual birth of new believers and the arrival of new faces to our service and to our family. We have seen the end of the Sunday School year and the beginning of an amazing new ministry to women called Connection Point. We have taken pause to mourn losses of loved ones and the closure of a church in our community, yet also paused to reflect on the fathers love in communion. At a time in our community and in our nation where pastors and churches are struggling to reach people, we are seeing revival. God is so good church, He is so so good.

A few things to note, beginning with our plans for Pentecost Sunday. That evening, we will be holding a service to celebrate the work of the Holy Spirit, the gift of the Spirit to the Church, and the way that He heals our body, mind and soul. There is no promise here of miracles happening, no smoke and mirrors of any kind, just an honest seeking after the Spirit and trusting that He is going to do what He has always done, love us and care for us and show up for us. I hope you'll make plans to join us for that service which begins at 7pm, Sunday the 19th.

Next, as we close in on nearly 30 weeks of reading in Public Reading of Scripture, we will be moving to a new format so that others can follow along, even if they miss a week. Make sure you subscribe to our Youtube Channel because in the coming weeks we will be launching a PRoS playlist that you can watch any time you want. Having a Bible reading strategy is so important and I pray that you would find the Lord working in you each time you open His Word. PRoS meets every Sunday from 6-7:15pm to listen to the Word of God together in community. I should mention that because of the Healing service, PRoS will take a break on the 19th.

And finally, just a challenge to issue, from me to you. Think about what you love most about your relationship with Jesus, and then tell someone else what you came up with. Imagine what would happen if we all took time this week to make Christ the focus of just one more conversation. I pray He opens doors for you to do that and that He works powerfully through those conversations for your good and for His glory.

Prayer Corner

Those "Ya Betcha Moments!"

One morning last week as I was in the produce department of a local store I struck up a conversation with a man who was searching for just the right package of romaine lettuce. As we talked, I made the comment, "Ya betcha", to which he replied, "You're from Minnesota!" How could he have known? In astonishment I told him I had been born in Minneapolis and had lived in Duluth for a couple of years too. It was my "ya betcha" that was the clue to my Minnesota connection. That little interaction led me to think about a spiritual application. Do people know you love Jesus by the way you talk and live your life? They should. Do they see Jesus in you at home, while driving or shopping, at church or in fact everywhere you go? They should.

Jesus tells us in Matthew 5:14-16

"You are the light of the world. A city on a hill cannot be hidden. Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead they put it on its stand and it gives light to everyone in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before men, that they may see your good deeds and praise your Father in heaven."

In II Corinthians 4: 6 we read

"For God, who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," made his light shine in our hearts to give us the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Christ."

God allows His light to shine in our hearts and out to others as a acknowledgement of what He has done in our hearts. This brings us hope to be able to face unexpected turn of events with grace and strength of character. We all face mountains from time to time but those mountains become conquerable hills and valleys when God's light is shining into a situation. When the light of Jesus is in you it becomes evident to those around you through your

words and actions. It is Him working through you! When your light shines out to others you aren't looking for the recognition or the approval of others.
