"Hey Second Family!!

I have been sitting in my office this morning, talking with the Lord about what to say in this letter, and my mind continues to be drawn to the beauty that He has been revealing to me in resting. We just went through the fourth commandment on Sabbath rest and so as my mind slowly unplugs from that concept to move into next week's message, I keep noticing the power that comes from being still, quiet, and trusting in Him to make the move. I am reminded of a quote I heard a long time ago "Every big move of God begins with not moving." I don't remember who said it but I do know that it has rung true in my own life so many times I've lost count. I encourage each of you to slow down this week, to rest in quiet stillness, and listen for Him to speak.

A few things to mention as we clear over the middle of another week. First, last night we had our first Intercessory Prayer gathering. As a group, we took time to lift up in prayer our church, our community, our nation and our world; and this covering of prayer is to become a staple of our church moving forward. Second, we are still and will always be looking for more individuals to volunteer to read scripture during our service. If you would like to read for us, the process is simple. Passages are chosen in advance by myself and you are given that info at least a week prior to you reading. you'll read from your own Bible, or from one of ours if you'd refer. Let me know via email (adam@secondcrcfremont.org) if you'd like to participate.

Also, it was brought to my attention in conversation with someone earlier this week that they don't come to Public Reading of Scripture on Sundays because they don't want to end up having to read, and don't want to have to say "no" when asked to read either. So I thought I'd clarify for everyone, PRoS does not include live Scripture reading by those who attend. We build a playlist on Youtube in advance of each week's gathering that includes a selection of texts from the Old and New Testament read to us from the NIV translation of the Bible (the same that we have in the pews for Sunday services). The words appear on the screen in the room for attendees to follow along, or they can follow in a physical Bible. At the end of the reading, we simply ask this question, "what did you hear or notice today in the reading?". That conversation can go in any number of directions and when it concludes, we pray to end the meeting. It is an easy way for believers and also for seekers and non-believers to get into the Word of God together and if you attend every week, you will have read the entire Bible in just over a year with only a 1 hour a week commitment.

Lastly, as mentioned last week and on Sunday, we are excited to be hosting a Ladies Painting Night on June 25th from 6:30-8pm for the women of Second Church and our community. Registration is open now either by the sign up sheet on the welcome desk, or by clicking this link, and money (\$15 for supplies) is due to the church office by June 21st. Unless you personally hand it to someone and tell them it's for the painting party, please be sure to indicate either on the check or on the envelope that you placed cash in, that it is for the painting party. That is especially true if you put the funds in one of our offering boxes; otherwise we won't know who the money came from or what it was to be used for.

I pray that you would welcome the opportunity to rest in God this week and that I will see each of you on Sunday to worship Him together.
