From the Desk of the Music Director:

Once again, I have the privilege of connecting with you in Second's Matters! I'm going to apologize in advance because it's long, but please take the time to read this! It includes a heads-up to some changes happening in worship, beginning this week Sunday, July 28.

First, a little bit of background. Every week, the staff works from a document in Planning Center that has a simple outline for each worship service: Awareness of God, Confession and Forgiveness, God Speaks, We Respond, and God Sends. The starting point is always Pastor Adam plugging in his sermon information. Then we start pulling the pieces together. We have been working with this format for several months and are always working to make it better. That brings us to the changes happening this week!

The ways things are now, our opening section, "Awareness of God," begins with a Gathering Song. If this is truly a "gathering" song, the worship committee discussed that it should probably be done while we are gathering, not once worship has begun. So, this song will be moved to a part of the pre-service music (at 9:25am), thereby also giving the Praise Team an opportunity to introduce new songs. When you hear the singing start, it's your reminder that worship is about to begin, and we need you to come in! The words to these new songs will be on the screen. If you are comfortable or familiar with the song(s), feel free to join in singing. If not, sit back, listen and learn. This time of singing will end at 9:30am, when our worship service will officially begin. Our new format will have many of the same elements, just in a slightly different order. Included now will be a welcome, a Bible reading calling us to worship, and an opening prayer. Until the new screen is up in the lobby, we will also have necessary announcements here. Then, after a time of mutual greeting, we will spend time in praise and worship through song. These songs will not only offer praise but will also lead us into the time of "Confession and Forgiveness" (the next section of Worship), which includes the congregational prayer. Following this, things will remain the same: "God Speaks," "We Respond," and "God Sends."

Change can be difficult. After a fair amount of time, the worship committee will again evaluate where we are and how things are going. As always, our goal is to lead in a way that will bring us closer to God both in worship and as we leave to serve. Your feedback is always welcome. Please feel free to stop in, call, or email. I am usually in-office on Monday and Wednesday mornings (but calling first would be advised). Please continue to keep both the staff and the Worship Committee in your prayers as together we strive to honor God through worship!
