Ishwar - Church Planter

Ishwar's background

"I used to believe in many deities and worshipped them. I was an orthodox Hindu person. I used to be very ill since childhood, and my family, too, had the challenges of my persistent health issues. Despite trying various treatments and consulting doctors, including resorting to exorcism, I saw no improvement. For 15 years, I remained in a state of illness, narrowly escaping death multiple times and accumulation significant debts."

Ishwar's testimony

"But then I found hope. One day, a Christian introduce us to the Lord. Gradually, I began to believe in the Lord. I started listening to God's Word regularly. One day, she shared John 5 about the man who waited for healing for 38 years. It resonated with our situation of waiting. After praying for me, I felt a divine touch, and my health began to recover. Growing in faith, a month later I received Jesus Christ. Thanks to the Lord, he influenced my father's mindset, leading him to declare that we would believe in Jesus, even if it meant forsaking all other gods and societal norms. We embraced the faith as a family".

Bhajeram Yadaw - church planter

Bhajeram's background

"I belonged to a Hindu family and worshipped all the deities. I believed that being born in a Hindu family was a blessing as we had many gods to protect us in difficult times. Initially, when I heard about Jesus, I perceived Him as a foreign God, and due this, I struggled to trust Him. Instead, I used to express disbelief and even criticized Him."

Bhajeram's testimony

"But then He worked in my life. My perspective began to change when my sister, who attended church, shared the Gospel with me multiple times. I questioned why she embraced a foreign God, but she insisted that Jesus is the living God, who sacrificed Himself for humanity. One day, she started reading verses like John 3:16 and Matthew 11: 28-30, illustrating how Jesus loves people and gave His life to save them. Gradually, as I continued reading the Bible, I discovered the words of the Lord and His miracles. This realization led me to understand that the Lord is not a foreign deity. He is our Savior. I surrendered my life to Jesus and joined the new life."
