Prayer Corner

More than a third of the 150 psalms in the Bible are psalms of lament. Some are individual in nature while others are for an entire community. Psalms of lament are songs and poems in which the psalmist cries out to God during difficult times. He asks God to intervene on his behalf and his petitions often give way to expressions of deep trust in God to respond in his favor. Joy, hope and renewal are often the outcomes.

We need to remember that our God is not a distant, uncaring, aloof Father. He hears our cries—and the psalmist knows this, too. God can handle our anger and our childish ways when we're impatient or upset when things don't move as we would like or at the speed we would like. At its core, lamenting is an act of faith, as we turn in faith to God who is in fact the only One to whom we can turn. When we lament, we acknowledge that God is everything. We call out to Him knowing He is there and we know He has a plan—even when we cannot see His plan or understand His workings.

For your prayerful meditation consider these selected verses of lament:

Psalm 10: 16-17

The Lord is King for ever and ever; the nations will perish from his land. You hear, O Lord, the desire of the afflicted; you encourage them, and you listen to their cry...

Psalm 42: 7, 11

Deep calls to deep in the roar of your waterfalls; all your waves and breakers have swept over me. Why are you downcast, O my soul? Why so disturbed within me? Put your hope in God, for I will yet praise him, my Savior and my God.

Psalm 86: 2-4

Guard my life, for I am devoted to you. You are my God; save your servant who trusts in you. Have mercy on me, O Lord, for I call to you all day long. Bring joy to your servant, for to you, O Lord, I lift up my soul.
